We acknowledge your concerns and recognize that the pending legal review of the related agreements for this project has taken longer to complete than originally projected, due to the complexities of the review and the availability of resources necessary to complete it.

I am pleased to inform you that we expect the results of this review to be ready for discussion by the end of August. Moreover, we will continue to monitor the Expedited Policy Development Process (EPDP) on the Temporary Specification for gTLD Registration Data to assess and consider any future impact on ICANN policies including Privacy & Proxy Services Accreditation.

As noted in your letter, the Privacy & Proxy Services Accreditation consensus policy represents another example of the success of the multi-stakeholder policy development process, and ICANN org appreciates your contributions to this effort. We look forward to continuing to work with you to complete this project.
