Executive Summary

ICANN's Global Stakeholder Engagement team for the Middle East (GSE Middle East) circulated a short survey to solicit the community's feedback on the first virtual Middle East Domain Name System Forum (ME DNS Forum) in both format and content.

40 respondents completed the survey. The respondents were from 25 countries, 16 of which are in the Middle East¹.

The following are selected highlights from the feedback collected:

- 62.50% of the respondents had attended one or more previous editions of the Middle East DNS Forum, while for the remaining 37.50%, the 2021 edition was their first.
- 92.50% of the respondents were either satisfied or very satisfied with the virtual setup of the forum. None of the respondents were dissatisfied.
- 97.50% of the respondents were either satisfied or very satisfied with the content of the agenda. None of the respondents were dissatisfied.
- 87.50% of the respondents were either satisfied or very satisfied with the format and the duration of the sessions. None of the respondents were dissatisfied.
- 37.50% of the respondents would like to see future forums take place in-person, 20% virtually, and the remaining 42.50% are fine with either format.

Survey Analysis

Introduction

The Middle East DNS Forum 2021 was held between 5-7 April 2021, in virtual format due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Over the course of three days, approximately 200 community members attended one or more sessions.

As is the custom, a short survey was circulated at the end of the forum, to solicit the community’s feedback on the event’s format and content, including the fact that it was held virtually.

Respondent Profile and Background

The survey was sent to 180 participants who attended the forum and provided valid email addresses when registering for the event. 40 respondents took part in the survey. The respondents were from 25 countries, 16 of which are in the Middle East.

The survey can be found in Appendix ‘A’.

ClickTools was the platform used for the survey.

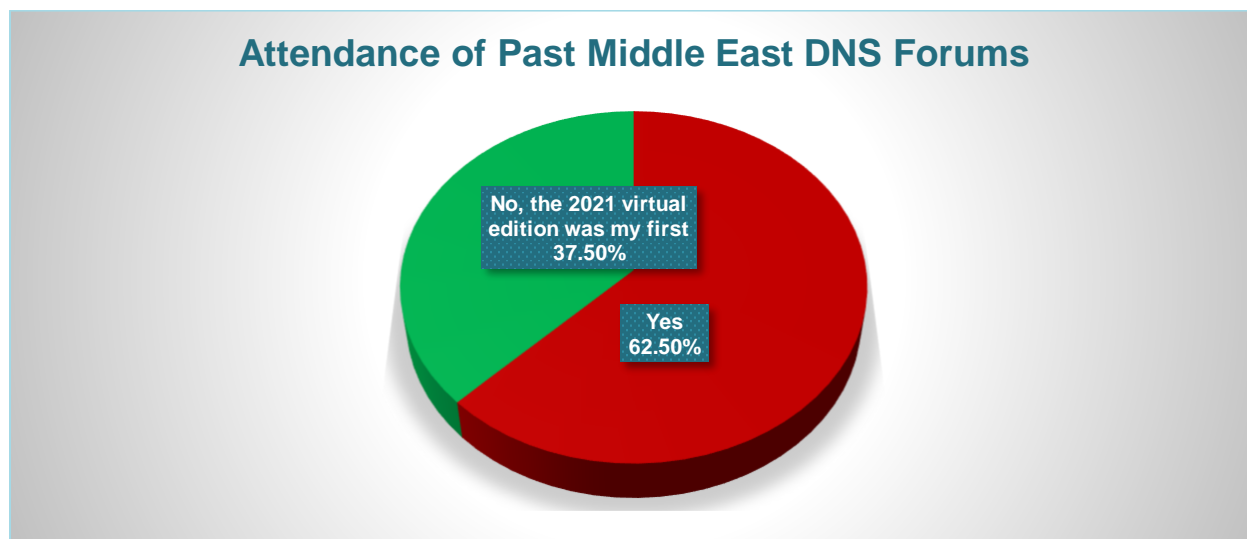


Figure 1: Attendance of Past Middle East DNS Forums

62.50% of respondents had attended one or more previous editions of the Middle East DNS Forum, while it was the first time for the remaining 37.50%. Figure 1 illustrates the input received.

Satisfaction with the Virtual Setup

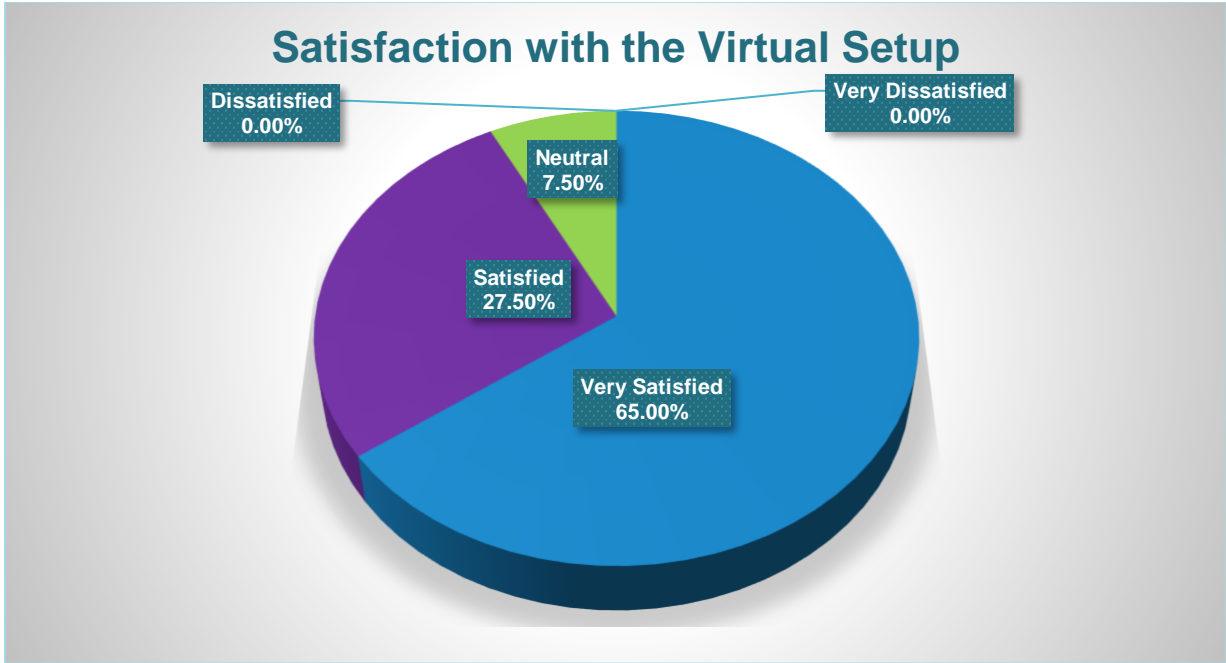


Figure 2: Satisfaction with the Virtual Setup

92.50% of the respondents were either satisfied or very satisfied with the virtual setup of the forum. The term “Virtual Setup” denotes the Zoom room, YouTube live streaming, interpretation, captioning, and other services were used to provide attendees with a seamless. None of the respondents were dissatisfied. Figure 2 illustrates the input received.

Satisfaction with the Agenda Content

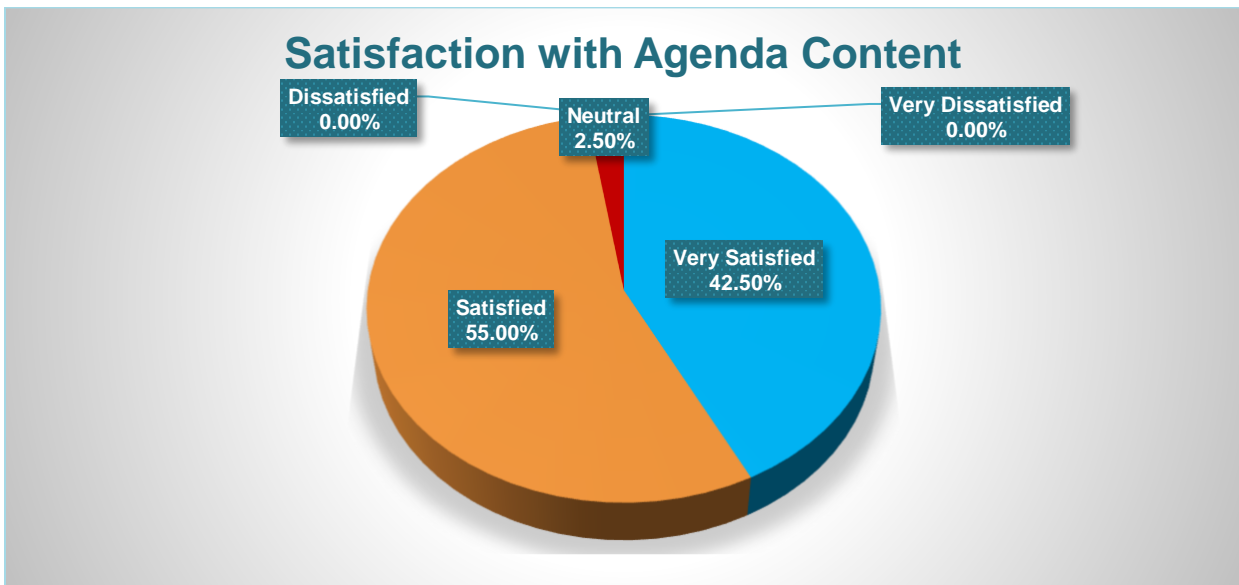


Figure 3: Satisfaction with the Content of the Agenda

97.50% of the respondents were either satisfied or very satisfied with the content of the agenda. None of the respondents were dissatisfied. Figure 3 illustrates the input received.

Satisfaction with Format and Duration of the Sessions

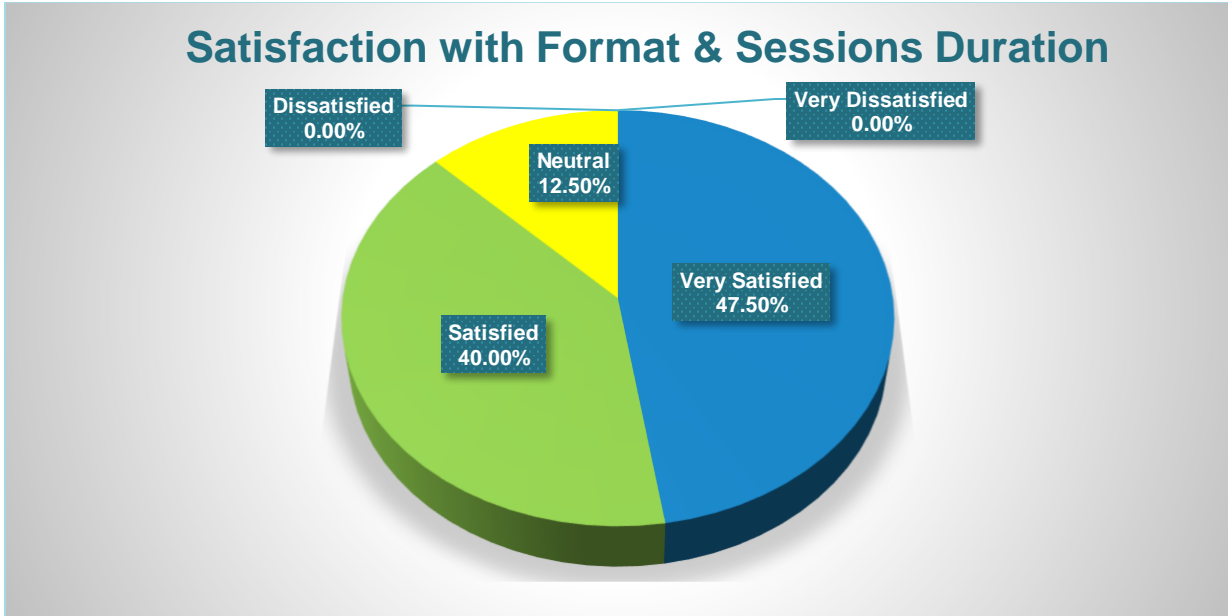


Figure 4: Satisfaction with Format and Duration of the Sessions

87.50% of the respondents were either satisfied or very satisfied with the format and the duration of the sessions. None of the respondents were dissatisfied. Figure 4 illustrates the input received.

Format of Future Middle East DNS Forums

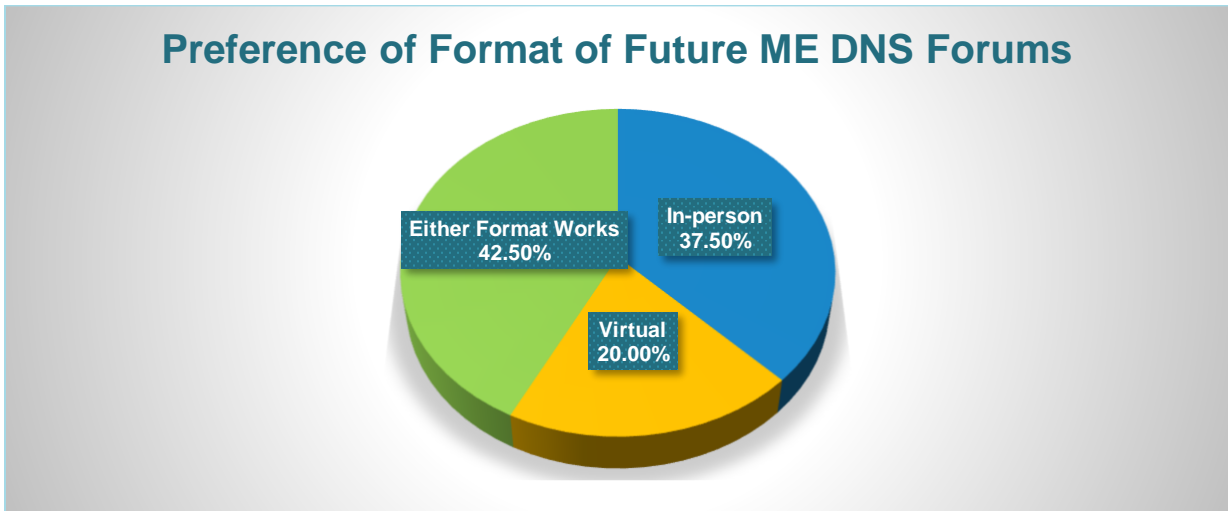


Figure 5: Preference of Format of Future Middle East DNS Forums

Respondents were asked about how they would like to see future Middle East DNS Forums take place. 37.50% of respondents responded they would like to see future forums take place in-person, 20% virtually, and the remaining 42.50% were fine with either format. Figure 5 illustrates the input received.

The results indicate that in-person forums remain the top choice.

Respondents were asked to elaborate further on their answers. Their responses are summarized below:

Supporters of In-Person Meetings	Supporters of Virtual Meetings
Better for networking, as it allows for more interactions during the meeting and also in	More flexible, more participation, and overall, more cost-effective

social arrangements around the meeting which helps build trust and friendship	
Many people are tired of virtual meetings	The best option when face-to-face meetings is not an option
There is no substitute for in-person meetings; they have more value	Allows for more engagement and participation from the community
Provides an opportunity to discuss real life experiences with other registry providers	Upgrading the virtual meeting (e.g., including breakout rooms and social sessions) would make it as useful as the in-person meeting, but with the benefit of wider participation and more inclusivity

Several respondents showed interest in the return to a hybrid format (in person and remote participation), and noted that it makes more sense, particularly as COVID-19 is here to stay.

Improving Future Middle East DNS Forums

Survey participants were also asked to provide suggestions on how to improve future Middle East DNS Forum. Responses are summarized as follows:

1. Include sessions on the agenda organized by Middle East community members (e.g., Middle East Space).
2. Organize a session for newcomers to help them understand the discussions during the forum.
3. Introduce new topics, and more information on TLDs and variants.
4. Train the moderators to ensure they have the required skills to moderate a good discussion with the panelists.
5. Bring different perspectives to the forum, as having all panelists sharing the same view does not enrich the discussion.
6. For forums in a virtual format, communicate with panelists in advance and test their audio/video connection prior to their respective sessions.
