Executive Summary

Financials and Long-Term Planning

• FY18 Q2 financials:

- Funding continues to be below our budget, and we expect this trend to continue through the remainder of the fiscal year.
- Our expenses are also below budget, more than offsetting the funding shortfall, as a result of slower progress on reviews, and the positive effect of tightening cost control throughout the organization.

 - Funding for FY19 is \$138 million, which is below the FY18 budget of \$143 million by \$5 million.

Policy Update: Supporting Organizations (SOs)



ccNSO

The ccNSO (Council and members) works on global policies relating to country code top-level domain name (ccTLD) policies (e.g., .br, .uk).

FY18 Q1

12 resolutions adopted3 policy activities underway



GNSO

The GNSO Council is composed of 21 members — divided into 2 houses (contracted and non-contracted parties) — who work on generic top-level domain name (gTLD) policies (e.g., .com, new gTLDs).



- 8 resolutions adopted
- **9** policy development processes underway



ASO

The ASO Address Council is composed of 15 volunteers — 3 from each of the Regional Internet Registries (RIRs)— who work on global Internet Protocol (IP) Address Policy.



Three SOs in the ICANN community are responsible for developing policy recommendations in the areas they represent.





- Restructured the ccNSO Strategic and Operational Planning Committee
- Produced statement on draft Operating Standards for Specific Reviews
- ccNSO Council Elections (councilors to take their seats at the end of ICANN61)



Management Update



Root KSK Roll Update

- Planned date of rollover is 11 October 2018
 - Draft rollover plan (based on community feedback) was posted on 1 February 2018
 - Public comment period closes 2 April 2018
- Analysis of new data since the decision to postpone (September 2017) does not reveal definitive actions
 - Modern DNS resolvers report trust anchor configuration to root servers
 - Attempts were made to contact operators of resolvers not updated with the new trust anchor
 - It was difficult to reach responsible parties
 - Only 20% could be located and responded
 - Of those responses, 60% were dynamic addresses (leaving no hope of finding more information)
 - For the remaining resolvers, no single cause for not updating could be determined.
 - This leaves no obvious actions or messaging going forward
- The number of resolvers reporting trust anchor configuration is continuing to increase
 - But so does the percentage of resolvers not updated with the new key
 - We are trying to determine the reason



Office of the CTO Update

- Continued progress on Open Data Initiative (ODI)
 - Compiling the initial version of the data census cataloging all internal data.
 The public pilots remain active now with three data sets (two were added in late 2017).
- Identifier Technology Health Initiative (ITHI) project continues
 - Metrics for measuring the health of naming identifiers have been developed and refined. Details were presented at ICANN60.
- Successful demo of DNS object prototype
 - Research project coined "DNS Objects" to store and retrieve complex, structured data using DNS.



Office of the CTO Update

- Support for dismantling Andromeda/Avalanche malware familes
 - O Subject Matter Expertise provided to EuroPol and the FBI in action against Avalanche and Andromeda malware families. The action cumulated in the dismantling of the malware underlying infrastructure and command and control mechanisms.

- Emerging identifiers research continues
 - Continued research into Emerging Identifier Systems. A risk analysis of the Digital Object Architecture (DOA) and a technical introduction to Blockchain Technology was presented at ICANN60
- DNS Abuse Analytics and Reporting (DAAR) Project matures
 - Renewed contract with developers for 2018 subscription service; many new features have been implemented. Working to define an API to help automate reporting, have completed work on a DAAR concept paper, and are pursuing third party review of our methodology.



GDD Highlights

- Framework for Registry Operator's Response to Security Threats published (20 October)
- Updated gTLD Marketplace Health Index published (14 December)
- Designated an emergency interim registry operator for top-level domain .WED. following a DNS critical function failure as well as other failures, and successfully restored the service through one of the ICANN designated Emergency Back-End Registry Operator (EBERO) providers.
- Domain Name Registrant Blog Educational Series entitled 'Do You Have a Domain Name? Here's What You Need to Know' continued; Two additional blogs published.
- ICANN approved Hurricane Maria and other similar natural disasters as extenuating circumstances under RAA section 3.7.5.1.
- Successfully completed String Evaluation of the proposed Internationalized Domain Name (IDN) country coded top-level domain (ccTLD) string for Mauritania (3 October)

The New gTLD Program is driving the largest expansion of the Domain Name System ever. Hundreds of new top-level domain names are being introduced into the Internet on a rolling basis.

WHY IT'S IMPORTANT

IDNs at the top-level enable Internet users to access domain names in local languages and scripts.

IDN ccTLDs allow countries and territories to represent their respective names scripts other than US-ASCII characters.













FY18 Year-to-date (Jul 17 – Dec 17) Operating & Capital Expenses








FY18 Year-to-date (Jul 17-Dec 17) New gTLD Program Expenses vs Budget & FY18


