

# GDD: Security, Stability and Resiliency Technology Update

#### WHY IT'S IMPORTANT

Maintaining the security, stability and resiliency of the Internet is a core part of ICANN's mission, and fundamental to the Internet and ICANN's work.

- DNSSEC Root Key Rollover
  - Held the first face-to-face meeting of the Root Key Signing Key Rollover Design Team at the Dallas IETF
  - Instituted weekly Design Team conference calls exploring issues that may impact our ability to update the root KSK



# GDD: New gTLD Program

#### WHY IT'S IMPORTANT

The New gTLD Program is the Internet's largest expansion ever, introducing hundreds of new top-level domain names which could become available in the next few years.

# GDD: Internationalized Domain Name (IDN) Program Update

#### WHY IT'S IMPORTANT


IDNs at the top-level enable Internet users to access domain names in their respective languages and scripts.

IDN ccTLDs allow countries and territories to represent their respective names in scripts other than US-ASCII characters.

- Internationalized Domain Name (IDN) Top Level Domains (TLDs) Program
  - Community-based panels for different scripts to develop rules for forming IDN TLD labels – ensuring linguistic expression with secure and stable solution
  - Arabic community completed work; Chinese and Japanese communities making good progress; Armenian, Cyrillic, Korean, Neo-Brahmi communities organized; Others initiating work
- IDN country-code Top Level Domains (ccTLDs) Process
  - o Completed five years of implementation
  - 46 IDN ccTLD labels successfully evaluated for 36 countries and territories; Armenia and Macao most recently announced

#### WHY IT'S IMPORTANT

Universal Acceptance means that users globally can access any name in any top-level domain (TLD) from any web browser, email client, or other Internet application through a computer or other electronic device.

- UASG will undertake activities to promote the Universal Acceptance of all valid domain names and email addresses
- Includes all ASCII domain names, ASCII email addresses, IDN domain names and IDN email





















# Budget remains balanced, with revenues and expenses expected to be lower than budget.






# New gTLD Program – Multi-year Forecast






# FY15 Q3 YTD Progress vs. Budget – New gTLD Program


